

Welcome to "Heyday" a riotous new play crafted in the bold tradition of Noel Coward's work by Monica Yell, our gifted (almost resident) Playwright. The play and production is bursting with irreverent humour, frenetic energy, and unapologetic wit, in a piece which at its heart, is a unique collaboration between playwright and Director from the piece's inception. This is a show that defies neat categorisation – a swirling vortex of modern ensemble prowess, visceral physicality, and comedic swagger, where characterisation, timing, and pace are the heartbeat of our absurd odyssey.

In "Heyday" we subvert expectations at every turn. Our cast – a dexterous ensemble of talented performers – embody a kaleidoscope of zany characters whose manic interactions propel us into a hilariously skewed universe. Think farce married to razor-sharp comedy, that jolts, jives, and careers wildly off-kilter – often simultaneously.

Our world premieres a script that lurches joyfully between the surreal and the brutally funny, spotlighting characters who stumble, collide, and somersault their way through the plots slapstick minefield. At its core, "Heyday" skewers the absurdities of self obsession and hubris with gleeful impunity – a raucous cocktail of misadventures, narcissism, and obsession that's perpetually on the knife-edge of chaos.

The play centres on Leonora Bow a once-renowned actress whose star has waned – yet she's gripped by a desperate longing to recapture her glittering past. In a bid to reclaim her glory days, Leonora, with the help of Dotty, a physic saleswoman of dubious integrity, concocts a hairbrained scheme involving time travel. But as her temporal machinations go haywire, the fabric of the contemporary world begins to unravel with delirious consequences. Past and present collide, sending everyone – and everything – careening into bedlam.

As director, I've revelled in sculpting this pandemonium - marrying the fearless spirit of Coward's boundary-pushing legacy with a more contemporary resonances. "Heyday" isn't just a play - it's an invitation to surrender to the exhilarating mess of it all, where hilarity and humanity collide with gleeful abandon.

Buckle in. The mayhem starts now.
